FAC Report

An information letter was received concerning possible 50/50 matching grant money available for development and acquisition of properties and facilities. A discussion ensued on the possibility of using this matching money for projects already existing for next year. Rob will show letter to Barry. A letter of intent must be received by September 26, 2014 with the final proposal due January, 2015.
