Camping is allowed - carry in carry out - no campfires allowed

No fireworks

No target shooting

No tree cutting or damage to the property

Please note hunting is allowed on the property and in the winter months the Scrub Oak Scramblers Snowmobile Club maintains trails throughout the forest.
